Cello Instructor

Ms. Abigail Fabian is a cellist from Simsbury, Connecticut.

She earned her Bachelor of Music in Cello Performance

from Boston University, where she studied with Michael Reynolds. She has attended and performed solo and chamber works at festivals in the United States and abroad, namely the Green Mountain Chamber Musical Festiva, Decoda Chamber Music Institute, and Techne Music Festival A dedicated teacher, she has taught cello privately for more than six years. She also earned a Masters in Music Education with teaching licensure at Boston University.

She completed her student teaching in high school strings, elementary strings, choir and AP Music Theory classes in Brookline Public Schools. Abigail is currently the graduate cello teaching assistant at West Virginia University. She performs in the graduate quartet, the Montani Quartet, and assists with teaching the celo studio. Abigail is working towards her Masters in Celo Performance. When not teaching or performing, she loves exercising, crafting, and reading.

Music & Movement and Music Theraphy Instructor

Ms. Chelsea Lehr is a Board-Certified Music Therapist, multi-instrumentalist, and recording artist who brings a warm, creative, and developmentally-focused approach to music. With a Bachelor of Music in Musica Theraphy from WVU and extensive clinical training at The Hochstein School (Roochester, NY), Chelsea has worked with children, teens, adults, older adults, and individuals with disabilities across a wide range of settings.

Ms. Losh will be leading our **Music & Movement** classes for toddlers and PreK- children, where she uses rhythm, movement, payful expration, and live music to support motor development, attention skills, communication, creativity, and socia interaction. Her joyful energy and multi-instrument skill set: violin (primary), cello, guitar, piano, voice, and ukulele create an engaging environment where little ones can grow through **nusic**.

In addition to early childhood classes, Ms. Losh offer individualized Music
Theraphy sessions for all ages, using musical instruments to support
emotional expression, sensory regulation, motor skills, anxiety reduction,
memory, focus, and overall well-being.

As a songwriter and performing artist, Chelsea has recorded with The New Rellcs, released her single"As Long As You're You" (2024), and is featured on her released album "Chelsea Losh Unprepared" (2025). She incorporates songwriting, storytelling, and creative expression into her sessions, offering therapeutic tools for students of any age. We are thrilled to have Ms. Losh join our academy and bring her expertise in Music & Movement, Music

Theraphy, and creative song writing to our community.
